Walking in Kingdom Identity as Sons and Daughters

Ice Breaker

Question: Share about a time when someone's identity (job title, family role, etc.) gave them access or authority you witnessed. How did that impact the situation?

Sermon Summary

This message focused on understanding our identity as sons and daughters of God rather than servants or slaves. Brother Nathan emphasized that the enemy's primary attack is on our identity, and when we don't know who we are in Christ, we fail to walk in the authority and power God has given us. The new birth (baptism in Jesus' name and receiving the Holy Ghost) establishes our proper bloodline and gives us both authority and power to advance God's kingdom.

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Discussion Questions

Section 1: Understanding Identity

1. Rev Nathan said, "There is an outright attack on identity in this hour." Where do you see this attack happening in culture today? How does it differ from (or mirror) the spiritual attack on our identity in Christ?
2. Read Luke 4:1-13. How did Satan attack Jesus' identity? What can we learn from Jesus' response when our identity is questioned?
3. How do you normally approach God – what do you say to Him in prayer? What does this reveal about your identity in relation to God? What do you think needs to change?

Section 2: Servant vs. Son Mentality

4. The sermon contrasted the older brother's servant mentality with the father's heart for sonship in Luke 15. What are the practical differences between living with a "servant mentality" versus a "son/daughter mentality" in your daily walk with God?
5. Rev Nathan said, "A servant says, 'I can't go there, I can't do that,' but a son says, 'This is mine, I can do this.'" What areas of your spiritual life have you been approaching with limitations that God wants you to approach with confidence?
6. How do we balance humility and servanthood (which Scripture also teaches) with the boldness and authority of sonship?

Section 3: Authority and Power

7. The message emphasized that "power without authority is useless." How does baptism in Jesus' name give us authority, and how does the Holy Ghost give us power? Why do we need both?
8. Read Acts 1:8. Rev Nathan says we are ambassadors representing the King of Kings. What does it mean practically to walk as an ambassador of Christ in your workplace, school, or neighbourhood?
9. Rev Nathan shared about going to nations simply because God told him to, trusting God to provide. Has God ever called you to something that required stepping out in faith? What happened? What held you back if you didn't go?

Section 4: Moving Higher

10. The Lord spoke during worship: "I'm calling you higher." What do you sense God is calling you (personally or as a church) to move into that you haven't stepped into yet?
 11. The sermon addressed fear, anxiety, and depression as symptoms of identity crisis. How does knowing your identity as a son/daughter of God combat these spiritual attacks?
 12. Rev Nathan said, "Flesh has to die so the spirit can live." What does dying to self look like in practical, everyday terms?
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Key Takeaways

- ✓ **Identity is the battlefield** – The enemy's primary strategy is to make us question who we are in Christ.
 - ✓ **We are sons and daughters, not servants** – This gives us access, authority, and confidence to approach God boldly.
 - ✓ **Baptism + Holy Ghost = Authority + Power** – We need both to walk in our full kingdom jurisdiction.
 - ✓ **Our relationship with God should be relational, not transactional.** It's also not based on feelings but on covenant promises.
 - ✓ **God is calling us higher** – There's more territory to take, but it requires us to walk in our true identity as His heirs.
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Practical Application

This Week's Challenge:

Choose ONE of the following to practice this week:

1. **Daily Declaration:** Each morning, declare your identity aloud: "I am a son/daughter of the Most High God. I have authority in Jesus' name and power through the Holy Ghost. I will walk in my kingdom identity today."
 2. **Prayer Posture Shift:** When you pray this week, consciously approach God as a beloved child approaching a good Father, not as a distant servant. Notice how this changes your prayers.
 3. **Identify One "Servant Limitation":** What's one area where you've been thinking "I can't" when God might be saying "You can in My name"? Take one step of faith in that area this week.
 4. **Territory Prayer Walk:** Walk through your neighbourhood, workplace, or area of influence and pray with authority, declaring God's kingdom over that place.
 5. **Identity Check:** When anxiety, fear, or depression tries to attack, immediately counter it by speaking your identity in Christ and commanding those spirits to leave in Jesus' name.
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Closing Reflection

Personal Reflection Question:

If you truly believed and walked in your identity as a son/daughter of God with full authority and power, what would change in your life this week?

Prayer Focus

- Pray for clarity of identity for each group member
 - Pray against spirits of anxiety, fear, and depression
 - Pray for boldness to walk in kingdom authority
 - Pray for the church to rise into the "higher calling" God is speaking
 - Pray for those going on mission trips this week
 - Pray for Singapore to fulfill its prophetic destiny as the "Antioch of the East"
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Closing Prayer

Have someone close in prayer, asking God to seal what was discussed and to help each person walk in their true identity as sons and daughters throughout the week.

For Next Week

Encourage group members to journal about moments when they practiced walking in their identity as sons/daughters and to share testimonies at the next meeting.
